Legislative Notes

As of February 4, the South Dakota Legislature has introduced one of the highest number of bills being considered since the mid-1990s: 551 bills. At least 30 of those are the infamous “hoghouse” bills. The Hoghouse Amendment is a legislative concept unique to South Dakota. It first appeared in 1921 when, according to [the Legislative Research Council](#), an expense allowance for lawmakers was tacked onto a bill to build a hog house on the campus of South Dakota State University, then South Dakota State College. The amendment process allows language of an existing bill to be replaced after the bill filing deadline. Hoghouse bills are introduced with generic titles that can easily be amended, acting as vehicles or placeholders, for legislative initiatives further on in the session calendar. CPCM monitors all hoghouse bills as they may eventually contain language to impact issues pertaining to the health and wellbeing of children.

There is a significant increase in House bills pertaining to the health and welfare of children and families. 2022 marks a record year for bill tracking as CPCM is monitoring approximately 86 bills (with 30+ being hoghouse bills). The [2022 Legislative Session](#) will run 37 days (four-day work weeks), ending on 3/28/22.

Bills

As of Friday, February 4, 2022, [339 House Bills and 212 Senate Bills](#) have been submitted for consideration. **Red highlight** indicates bill has been deferred to the 41st Legislative Day or failed a Do Pass motion (died). **Green highlight** indicates bill has passed and will be presented to Governor Noem for consideration. **Yellow highlight** indicates the bill is at conference committee or is being considered for veto from Governor Noem.

CPCM is actively tracking the following bills:

[HB 1005](#): An Act to provide for the designated use of public school multi-occupancy rooms and sleeping rooms.

Sponsor: Representative Deutsch, et. al. and Senator Symens, et. al. Committee Assignment: House State Affairs. Scheduled for hearing on 1/31/22. Passed State Affairs. Was amended on the House floor and passed as amended. Referred to Senate Judiciary.

HB 1005 creates designated changing rooms, rest rooms and sleeping rooms in public schools for the exclusive use by members of the same sex. The bill allows a student the right for a private cause of action against a school district if an employee of the district expressly allows a student of the opposite sex to use the designated room. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1006](#): An Act to promote continued fairness in women's sports.

Sponsor: Representative Milstead, et. al. and Senator Suttons, et. al.

Committee Assignment: NA

HB 1006 requires an athlete to designate a term of biological sex as assigned at birth. The bill allows a student the right for a private cause of action against a school district if the law is violated. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1012](#): An Act to protect students from critical race theory.

Sponsor: The Committee on Education at the request of the Office of the Governor.

Committee Assignment: House Education.

HB 1012 prohibits an institution of higher education under the control of the Board of Regents or Board of Technical education to direct or compel a student to adopt, affirm or adhere to the tenets of critical race theory. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1015](#): An Act to require a moment of silence in schools to begin the school day.

Sponsor: The Committee on Education at the request of the Office of the Governor.

Committee Assignment: House Education. Scheduled for hearing 1/21/22. Deferred to the 41st legislative day.

HB 1015 requires each school to have a moment of silence lasting up to one minute each morning that school is in session. The moment of silence allows for prayer, reflection, and meditation as desired. No school employee may dictate the action taken by students or other employees during the moment of silence. No student may interfere with another student's engagement in the moment of silence. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1016](#): An Act to make an appropriation for costs related to disasters in the state and to declare an emergency.

Sponsor: The Committee on Appropriations at the request of the Dept. of Public Safety.

Committee Assignment: House Appropriations

HB 1016 provides for \$2,956,882 from the general fund to go toward special emergency and disaster special revenue for disasters in the state. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

- *Note: disaster relief funds have been used for mental health purposes in the past. There is no definition for disaster in this bill.*

[HB 1019](#): An Act to make an appropriation for payment of extraordinary litigation expenses and to declare an emergency.

Sponsor: The Committee on Appropriations at the request of the Bureau of Administration.

Committee Assignment: House Appropriations

HB 1019 provides for \$1,500,000 from the general fund to go toward extraordinary litigation expenses. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1024](#): An Act to revise and repeal certain provisions regarding self-support tuition rates at off-campus locations governed by the Board of Regents.

Sponsor: The Committee on Appropriations at the request of the Board of Regents.

Committee Assignment: House Appropriations. Scheduled for hearing on 1/26/22. Passed Education and placed on consent calendar. Fiscal note requested and removed from consent calendar. Note: the tuition rate may impact for-credit courses taught by CPCM.

HB 1024 removes the off-campus rate for tuition at BOR schools. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1026](#): An Act to prohibit eligibility for a suspended imposition of sentence for the crime of rape.

Sponsor: Representative Fitzgerald, et. al. and Senator Wiik, et. al. Committee Assignment: House Judiciary. Scheduled for hearing 1/26/22. Amended in House Judiciary and passed as amended. Passed the House floor. Referred to Senate Judiciary.

HB 1026 removes the ability for a person who has been convicted, pled guilty, or nolo contendere to rape under § 22-22-1 to be granted a suspended imposition of sentence. *CPCM will watch bill.*

[HB 1068](#): An Act to clarify the processing of sexual assault kits performed on individuals ages sixteen and seventeen.

Sponsor: Representative Reed, et. al. and Senator Duhamel, et. al. Committee Assignment: House Judiciary. Scheduled for hearing 1/19/2022. Passed out of committee and placed on House consent calendar. Passed House floor and assigned to Senate Judiciary. Amended in Senate Judiciary and passed. Passed Senate floor. Failed to concur on House floor and assigned a Conference Committee. Scheduled for hearing 2/5/22.

HB 1068 codifies the mandatory reporter process when a victim of a sexual assault is a minor age sixteen or seventeen and is seen at a health care facility. *CPCM will support this bill.*

[HB 1094](#): An Act to revise provisions related to medical cannabis for the protection of youth.

Sponsor: Representative Milstead and Senator Deutsch

Committee Assignment: House Health and Human Services. Scheduled for hearing 1/27/22. Do Pass vote failed and report out of committee without recommendation. Placed on calendar 1/31/22.

HB 1094 prohibits the use of medical cannabis on school properties. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1099](#): An Act to revise provisions related to courtroom modifications for child witnesses.

Sponsor: Representative Reed, et. al. and Senator Duhamel, et. al.

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary. Scheduled for hearing on 2/7/22.

HB 1099 enhances protections for children up to the age of 18 who testify in court regarding sexual abuse, physical abuse, neglect or human trafficking. *CPCM will support this bill.*

[HB 1100](#): An Act to revise provisions related to the video recording of certain victim testimony at a preliminary hearing or deposition.

Sponsor: Representative Reed, et. al. and Senator Duhamel, et. al.

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary. Scheduled for hearing on 2/7/22.

HB 1100 allows for a victim's testimony at a preliminary hearing or deposition to be recorded on video if the victim is less than 18 years old. *CPCM will support this bill.*

[HB 1108](#): An Act to revise provisions related to driving under the influence.

Sponsor: The Committee on Judiciary at the request of the Chief Justice

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary. Scheduled for hearing 1/24/22. Passed unanimously and placed on House consent calendar. Passed House floor. Referred to Senate Judiciary and scheduled a hearing for 2/3/22. Passed Judiciary and placed on consent.

HB 1108 adds childcare drop off or pick up for the exception to allow a person to operate a vehicle after receiving a DUI, upon approval from the court. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1110](#): An Act to revise a provision related to the appointment of a guardian ad litem or a special advocate to represent an abused or neglected child.

Sponsor: The Committee on Judiciary at the request of the Chief Justice

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary. Scheduled for hearing 1/24/22. Motion to defer to another day. Scheduled for hearing 1/31/22. Amended in and passed House Judiciary. Passed House floor and referred to Senate Judiciary.

HB 1110 changes the court's requirement for appointing a guardian ad litem or a special advocate from shall to may. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1113](#): An Act to prohibit threats made with the intent to coerce an abortion and to provide a penalty therefor.

Sponsor: Representative Randolph and Senator Castleberry

Committee Assignment: N/A

HB 1113 provides a Class B felony if a person intends to cause a pregnant mother to undergo an abortion against her will. The person is guilty of a Class 5 felony if the threat causes the mother to follow through with the abortion. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1124](#): An Act to accommodate legislation on medical services.

Sponsor: Representative Peterson (Kent) and Senator Cammack

Committee Assignment: House State Affairs

HB 1124 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1125](#): An Act to accommodate legislation relating to education in South Dakota.

Sponsor: Representative Peterson (Kent) and Senator Cammack

Committee Assignment: House State Affairs

HB 1125 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1126](#): An Act to accommodate legislation relating to the protection of public safety.

Sponsor: Representative Peterson (Kent) and Senator Cammack

Committee Assignment: House State Affairs

HB 1126 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1127](#): An Act to enhance South Dakota.

HB 1159 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1163](#): An Act to provide for the use of screening instruments in determining kindergarten readiness.

Sponsor: Representative Olson (et. al.) and Senator Smith (VJ)

Committee Assignment: House Education

HB 1163 allows a child to enter kindergarten if they turn 5 by Dec. 31st of that year and pass a screening ensuring kindergarten preparedness. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1171](#): An Act to revise provisions related to missing children.

Sponsor: Representative Pourier (et. al.) and Senator Foster (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary

HB 1171 requires notice to be sent local media regarding missing children. This expands the current Amber Alerts. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1200](#): An Act to establish criteria for temporary custody and visitation orders.

Sponsor: Representative Pischke

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary

HB 1200 requires a presumption of joint physical custody in initial custody arrangements and standard guidelines. *CPCM will oppose this bill.*

[HB 1201](#): An Act to address determinations regarding physical custody of a minor.

Sponsor: Representative Pischke

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary

HB 1201 is a partner bill to HB 1200 and strikes language negating presumption of joint custody. *CPCM will oppose this bill.*

[HB 1202](#): An Act to provide for custody entitlement of a child born out of wedlock.

Sponsor: Representative Pischke

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary

HB 1202 states that either the mother or father is entitled to child's custody. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1217](#): An Act to expand criminal provisions regarding the protection of minors from certain forms of sexual exploitation

Sponsor: Representative Hansen (et. al.) and Senator Kolbeck (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary

HB 1217 adds the production of pornography and sexual exploitation of a minor to the definition of human trafficking. The bill also adds the crime of grooming in relation sexual exploitation of a minor. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1218](#): An Act to revise the definition of abused or neglected child to include minors subject to human trafficking.

Sponsor: Representative Hansen (et. al.) and Senator Kolbeck (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary

HB 1218 adds the definition of human trafficking to the definition of abused or neglected child. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1220](#): An Act to establish a safe harbor for child survivors of certain forms of human trafficking.

Sponsor: Representative Hansen (et. al.) and Senator Kolbeck (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary

HB 1220 delineates the requirements of law enforcement officers when they encounter a minor who may be exhibiting signs of prostitution. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1221](#): An Act to require training on human trafficking for law enforcement officers.

Sponsor: Representative Hansen (et. al.) and Senator Kolbeck (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary

HB 1221 outlines 6 training objectives for law enforcement to be implemented on a bi-annual basis. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1222](#): An Act to provide property tax relief for family day care homes.

Sponsor: Representative Cwach

Committee Assignment: House Taxation

HB 1222 reduces the amount of property tax paid by family day care providers by adjusting the assessed value of the home. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1223](#): An Act to authorize the provision of informed consent by a pregnant minor.

Sponsor: Representative Healy (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Health and Human Services

HB 1223 allows a pregnant minor who has the mental capacity to make informed medical or dental consent to services, including hospitalization, surgery, and pre/postnatal care. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1225](#): An Act to make an appropriation to provide for the development of South Dakota and to declare an emergency.

Sponsor: Representative Karr

Committee Assignment: NA

HB 1225 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1226](#): An Act to make an appropriation to improve healthcare in South Dakota and to declare an emergency.

Sponsor: Representative Karr

Committee Assignment: NA

HB 1246 provides for a parent's fundamental right to make decisions concerning the upbringing, education, and care of a child. No state agency may abridge or encroach upon that right. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1251](#): An Act to address lobbying.

Sponsor: Representative Haugaard

Committee Assignment: NA

HB 1251 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1264](#): An Act to make an appropriation for the Liaison for Missing and Murdered Indigenous Persons Office, and to declare an emergency.

Sponsor: Representative Pourier (et. al.) and Senator Foster (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary. Amended in House Judiciary and referred to House Committee on Appropriations.

HB 1264 provides for funding for up to 5 years for the MMIP Liaison at the SD AG Office. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1270](#): An Act to require a defendant in a criminal proceeding to be physically present during the reading of victim impact statements.

Sponsor: Representative Pourier (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary.

HB 1270 requires a defendant to be physically present during the reading of victim impact statements. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1272](#): An Act to revise provisions related to counseling for domestic abuse defendants.

Sponsor: Representative Reimer (et. al.) and Senator Diedrich (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary.

HB 1272 requires counseling for domestic abuse defendants and allows the court to recommend the counseling program. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1278](#): An Act to revise the child support obligation schedule.

Sponsor: Representative Stevens (et. al.) and Senator Rusch (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary.

HB 1278 adjusts the rate of child support. This is a result of the workgroup formed to regularly address child support modifications. *CPCM will support this bill.*

[HB 1279](#): An Act to revise certain provisions relating to child support.

Sponsor: Representative Stevens and Senator Rusch

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary.

HB 1279 addresses the division of child support and any abatements. This is a result of the workgroup formed to regularly address child support modifications. *CPCM will support this bill.*

[HB 1287](#): An Act to revise certain provisions regarding the crime of rape and provide a penalty therefor.

Sponsor: Representative Reed (et. al.) and Senator Diedrich (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary.

HB 1287 includes consent language within the definition of rape and creates a class 4 felony. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1290](#): An Act to prohibit lobbying by state officials and employees.

Sponsor: Representative Milstead (et. al.) and Senator Frye-Mueller (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: House Judiciary.

HB 1290 prohibits any state employee from lobbying, eliminating the Blue Badge process. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1294](#): An Act to address early learning and child care.

Sponsor: Representative Healy and Senator Nesiba

Committee Assignment: House Education

HB 1294 is a Hogue-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1299](#): An Act to establish requirements for higher education.

Sponsor: Representative Tidemann

Committee Assignment: House Education

HB 1299 is a Hogue-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1302](#): An Act to modify tuition responsibilities for children in residential treatment centers.

Sponsor: Representative Duba

Committee Assignment: House Education

HB 1302 requires the school district where the residential treatment center is located to provide education for the student. The bill also defines residential treatment centers. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1303](#): An Act to address elementary and secondary education.

Sponsor: Representative Duba

Committee Assignment: House Education

HB 1303 is a Hogue-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1304](#): An Act to address child care.

Sponsor: Representative Duba

Committee Assignment: House Education

HB 1304 is a Hogue-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1311](#): An Act to clarify the means of voluntarily terminating a relationship between a birth mother and a child.

Sponsor: Representative Soye and Senators Steinhauer and Novstrup

Committee Assignment: House State Affairs

HB 1311 states that the provisions of SDCL 22-5A and 22-6 are the only means to voluntarily end a birth mother's relationship with a child. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1313](#): An Act to expand the definition of community safety zone in relation to the sex offender registry.

Sponsor: Representative Miskimins (et. al.) and Senators Klumb and Wiik

Committee Assignment: House Local Government

HB 1313 includes the definition of daycare facility in a community safe zone. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1315](#): An Act to clarify provisions related to foster care.

Sponsor: Representative York

Committee Assignment: House Health and Human Services

HB 1315 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1317](#): An Act to enhance the Battleship South Dakota Memorial.

Sponsor: Representative Willadsen and Senator Kolbeck

Committee Assignment: House Local Government

HB 1317 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1333](#): An Act to make an appropriation of American Rescue Plan Act moneys for child care grants and to declare an emergency.

Sponsor: The Committee on Appropriations

Committee Assignment: The Joint Committee on Appropriations. Scheduled for a hearing on 2/7/22.

HB 1333 creates legislative oversight for approximately \$90million in funds currently managed by the Department of Social Services. This bill effectively puts on hold the child care grants being distributed by DSS. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1334](#): An Act to make an appropriation of American Rescue Plan Act moneys for certain home and community-based services and to declare an emergency.

Sponsor: The Committee on Appropriations

Committee Assignment: The Joint Committee on Appropriations. Scheduled for a hearing on 2/7/22.

HB 1333 creates legislative oversight for approximately \$90million in funds currently managed by the Department of Social Services. This bill effectively puts on hold DSS ARPA distributions for mental health, substance abuse and other community-based services. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[HB 1339](#): An Act to make an appropriation to provide contingency funds for unanticipated costs and to declare an emergency.

Sponsor: The Committee on Appropriations

Committee Assignment: The Joint Committee on Appropriations

HB 1339 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 7](#): An Act to revise provisions related to custody and visitation rights by medical cannabis cardholders.

Sponsor: Senator Wheeler, et. al. and Representative Fink, et. al., at the request of the Marijuana Interim Study Committee.

Committee Assignment: Senate Judiciary. Scheduled for hearing on 1/25/22. Passed Senate Judiciary and Senate floor.

SB 7 states that being a card holder is not an automatic presumption of unfit or unsafe parents for custody determination; the custody determination should be made in the best interest of the child. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 28](#): An Act to disqualify for life any person from driving a commercial vehicle who is convicted of a felony offense involving human trafficking.

Sponsor: The Committee on Transportation at the request of the Dept. of Public Safety.

Committee Assignment: Senate Transportation. Scheduled for Hearing: 1/19/2022. Passed committee unanimously and placed on consent calendar. Passed Senate floor and assigned to House Transportation. Passed House Transportation and House floor. Signed by both the President and the Speaker, delivered to Governor for signature.

SB 28 disqualifies a person from maintaining a commercial driving license in South Dakota if they have been convicted of human trafficking. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 46](#): An Act to protect fairness in women's sports.

Sponsor: The Committee on State Affairs at the request of the Office of the Governor.

Committee Assignment: Senate State Affairs

Scheduled for Hearing: 1/14/2022. Motion to amend passed. Passed State Affairs. Amended on the Senate floor. Passed Senate floor and referred to House State Affairs. Passed House State Affairs and House floor. Signed by both the President and the Speaker, signed by Governor on 2/3/22.

SB 46 designates athletes as males or females based on their biological sex as listed on the athlete's official birth certificate near time of birth. The bill also provides a penalty for violation of the proposed law. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 72](#): An Act to establish the crime of hazing and to provide a penalty therefor.

Sponsor: Senator Rohl, et. al. and Representative Rehfeldt, et. al. Committee

Assignment: Senate Judiciary. Scheduled for hearing 1/25/22. Amended in

Senate Judiciary and passed as amended. Passed Senate floor.

SB 72 establishes the crime of hazing and provides a penalty. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 77](#): An Act to enhance the penalty on registered sex offenders who commit sexual contact without consent from a person capable of consenting.

Sponsor: Senator Duhamel and Representatives Fitzgerald and Reed

Committee Assignment: Senate Judiciary. Amended in Senate

Judiciary and passed as amended. Passed Senate floor.

SB 77 makes it a felony offense to commit sexual contact if the offender is on the registered sex offender list. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 81](#): An Act to revise the definition of sexual contact.

Sponsor: Senator Duhamel and Representative Reed

Committee Assignment: Senate Judiciary. Scheduled for hearing 1/20/22.

Passed Senate Judiciary unanimously. Passed Senate floor unanimously.

Referred to House Judiciary.

SB 81 includes the terms buttocks and inner thigh in the definition of sexual contact. *CPCM will support this bill.*

[SB 82](#): An Act to revise the admissibility of certain statements made by persons with developmental disabilities concerning certain crimes.

Sponsor: Senator Duhamel and Representative Reed

Committee Assignment: Senate Judiciary. Scheduled for hearing 1/25/22.

Tabled.

SB 82 cleans up language regarding the admissibility of statements of a person with disabilities in criminal proceedings. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 89](#): An Act to require insurers to provide coverage for hearing aids and related services to persons under age nineteen.

Sponsor: Senator Tobin and Representative Davis

Committee Assignment: Senate Health and Human Services

SB 89 requires insurance companies to cover hearing aids and services to persons under 19. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 102](#): An Act to create the Medicaid expansion fund and to provide for the receipt of monies received as a result of expanding Medicaid eligibility.

Sponsor: Senator Steinhauer (et. al.) and Representative Tidemann (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: Senate Health and Human Services. Scheduled for hearing 2/4/22.

Amended in Senate Health and Human Services, passed as amended.

SB 102 establishes a Medicaid expansion fund. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 103](#): An Act to make an appropriation to support the teen court grant program and to declare an emergency.

Sponsor: Senator Hunoff (et. al.) and Representative Tidemann (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: Senate Judiciary. Referred to Joint Committee on Appropriations.

SB 103 provides \$500,000 to fund the teen court program. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 120](#): An Act to include intentionally manipulated images or recordings in the crime of invasion of privacy recording.

Sponsor: Senator Castleberry (et. al.) and Representative Bordeaux (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: Senate Judiciary.

SB 120 adds the crime of disseminating or selling fake images (deep fake). *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 141](#): An Act to establish provisions for the SD Retirement System.

Sponsor: Senator Cammack and Representative Peterson (Kent)

Committee Assignment: Senate Retirement Laws

SB 141 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 142](#): An Act to establish provisions for medical services.

Sponsor: Senator Cammack and Representative Peterson (Kent)

Committee Assignment: Senate State Affairs

SB 142 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 143](#): An Act to establish provisions related to education.

Sponsor: Senator Cammack and Representative Peterson (Kent)

Committee Assignment: Senate State Affairs

SB 143 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 144](#): An Act to establish provisions related to public safety.

Sponsor: Senator Cammack and Representative Peterson (Kent)

Committee Assignment: Senate State Affairs

SB 144 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 155](#): An Act to create the families first grant program and to make an appropriation therefor.

Sponsor: Senators Kolbeck and Klumb and Representative Rehfeldt (et. al.)

Committee Assignment: Senate Health and Human Services

HB 155 appropriates \$6 million to supplement VOCA funding and creates a grant program for the funds. *CPCM will support this bill.*

[SB 161](#): An Act to provide housing opportunities.
Sponsor: Senator Foster and Representative Smith (Jamie)
Committee Assignment: Senate Commerce and Energy
SB 161 is a Hoghouse-Vehicle Bill. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 186](#): An Act to expand Medicaid eligibility by the Legislature.
Sponsor: Senator Foster (et.al.) and Representative Blare (et.al.)
Committee Assignment: Senate Health and Human Services
SB 186 expands Medicaid to South Dakotans aged 18 to 65 whose income is at or below 133% of the federal poverty level . *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 194](#): An Act to make an appropriation to the Department of Education to provide grants to organizations that provide early education programs.
Sponsor: Senator Maher
Committee Assignment: Senate Health and Human Services
SB 194 provides \$1 million for electronic, in-home early education services for children. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 198](#): An Act to revise provisions related to juvenile offenders.
Sponsor: Senators Smith (VJ) and Shoenbeck and Representative Deutsch (et. al.)
Committee Assignment: Senate State Affairs
SB 198 provides creates an interim juvenile placement committee to provide recommendations for 2023 legislation. The bill also changes significant provisions to juvenile detention. *CPCM will watch this bill.*

[SB 199](#): An Act to revise provisions related to a name change for certain crime victims.
Sponsor: Senators Diedrich
Committee Assignment: Senate Judiciary
SB 199 provides parameters around when a name change can occur for a minor victim of human trafficking and the issuance of a birth certificate. *CPCM will watch this bill.*
